

Ace 55 Determinate

A 1950s heirloom, 'Ace 55' has excellent, fresh tomato flavor and is a lower-acid tomato. An old favorite for canning, 5"-6" diameter, 6-8 ounce fruits are just the right size to quarter and pack into jars. Yields are exceptional; as a determinate type, the majority of the fruits ripen over a 1 to 2 week period. In areas with a long growing season, sow in succession.



Amana Indeterminate

Huge heirloom beefsteak tomato named for the Amana Colonies in Iowa. These organic tomato seeds produce big, regular leaf plants that produce above average amounts of beautiful light-orange, irregular shaped (fluted) heirloom tomatoes that can grow to 2 pounds or more, with an average diameter of 5 inches. Excellent sweet, almost tropical fruit flavors



Amish Paste Indeterminate

Many seed savers believe this is the ultimate paste tomato. Giant, blocky, Roma type tomatoes have delicious red flesh that is perfect for paste and canning. It has world-class flavor and comes from an Amish community in Wisconsin.



Ananas Noire (black pineapple) Indeterminate

This unusual variety was developed by Pascal Moreau, a horticulturist from Belgium. The multi-colored, smooth fruit (green, yellow and purple mix) weighs about 1½ lbs. The flesh is bright green with deep red streaks. Everyone loves its superb flavor that is outstanding, being both sweet and smoky with a hint of citrus.



Anna Russian Indeterminate

Heirloom variety brought to the United States by Russian immigrants and eventually introduced to gardeners by Craig LeHoullier, who offered it in the 1989 Seed Savers Exchange Yearbook. Plants produce an abundance of reddish-pink, heart-shaped tomatoes weighing around 10-12 ounces each. Fruit have excellent flavor with a great sweet-acid balance. A great dual-purpose variety for both slicing and canning. 85 days to harvest.



Arkansas Traveler Indeterminate

An old Southern heirloom esteemed for its ability to produce flavorful tomatoes under conditions of drought and high heat where many other varieties fail. Good disease resistance. Medium-size, pink fruits with wonderful flavor. Keeps well.



Aunt Ruby's Indeterminate

85 days. One of the largest green beefsteaks. Can grow to over 1 pound and is delicious. It has brilliant, neon-green flesh with a strong, sweet, and fruity flavor, much tastier than most red tomatoes. This family heirloom from Germany is beautiful. The winner of the 2003 Heirloom Garden Show's taste test.



Beauty King Indeterminate

Plants bear large harvests of these tomatoes with sweet, rich and delicious flavor that is quite outstanding. Brad Gates of Wild Boar Farms developed this variety by crossing Big Rainbow with Green Zebra. Indeterminate.



Beefsteak indeterminate

Beefsteaks are always grown for their flavor and size for slicing and summer sandwiches. This variety produces large, meaty red fruit over a long season on indeterminate plants. Because it matures late compared to many other tomatoes, it will provide a fresh harvest in the latter part of the season. This is an old favorite beloved by gardeners in the Northeast and grown throughout the country. Vigorous vines grow best in tall cages.



Bella Rosa Determinante

67-75 days. This juicy, great tasting beauty is one perfect Tomato. It yields an abundance of large (10- to 12-ounce), round fruit with smooth, deep red skin that is thin, but doesn't crack. Growing on determinant vines, Bella Rosa performs well in high heat and humidity with good disease resistance.



Better Boy Indeterminate

High yields of smooth skinned, large fruit earn Better Boy a spot as one of the most popular tomatoes grown in the US and as one of our all time best sellers. The fruit has excellent classic tomato flavor with just the right balance of acid and sugar. This is a great slicing tomato.



Big Beef Indeterminate

The large fruit has old-time tomato flavor and the vines are resistant to many of the problems that can discourage gardeners. The fruit is borne on vigorous, indeterminate vines from summer until frost. Compared to other beefsteak types, Big Beef is early and will set fruit reliably even in cool, wet weather.



Big Rainbow Indeterminate

Huge fruit up to 2 lbs.; delicious and sweet tasting. These tomatoes are very striking sliced, as the yellow fruit has neon red streaking through the flesh. An heirloom preserved by members of Seed Savers Exchange.



Black Brandywine Indeterminate

These medium-to-large beefsteak fruits have a purplish hue and an oblate shape, with a firm slicing texture and a juicy core. Perfect for slicing, cooking, canning, drying, and more, it's considered by many to be the standard of flavor and beauty for heirloom tomatoes.



Black Cherry Indeterminate

With a lower acidity level than many other tomatoes, the black cherry tomato has a sweet, smokey flavor.

Black cherry tomatoes are strikingly dark-colored. Their beautiful burgundy skin, as well as their flavor, sets them apart from many other kinds of tomatoes. You can add these unique tomatoes to your recipes for a pop of unexpected color.



Black From Tula Indeterminate

The Black from Tula is a delicious Russian tomato that makes for a great slicer. This old Russian heirloom produces tomatoes with an unique deep purple color with a rich sweet flavor. The Black from Tula is widely known as one of the best flavored dark tomatoes and when mature, this variety grows up to 14 ounces.



Black Krim Indeterminate

Native to Russia, Black Krim tomatoes produce beefsteak-type tomatoes that can show unique dark violet coloration when given plenty of sun exposure. They are indeterminate, and typically require 70-90 days to reach maturity after transplant. Black Krim are renowned for their great, mildy-tart taste.



Black Russian Indeterminate

Black Russian tomatoes are dark, deep red to shiny black fruit with heavy green shoulders, looking almost like a conker. The flesh is deep reddish-green and has an unusual rich but sweet taste which has to be tasted to be believed. It is an early maturing.



Blush Indeterminate

The Blush Tomato is part of the beautiful and tasty Artisan tomato collection and has a sweet, fruity flavor that is great for fresh eating. The delicious bright yellow tomato produces red marbling stripes when mature. The attractive Blush mixes beautifully with the other Artisan tomatoes. Blush's flavor is bright, sweet and tropical. Grows well in containers or in the ground.



Brad's Atomic Grape Indeterminate

These elongated multi-colored large cherries grow in clusters. Lavender and purple striped when immature, turning to green, red / brown with anthocyanin blue stripes when fully ripe.



Bull's Heart Indeterminate

Their deep pink heart-shaped fruits have a sweet, rich, complex flavor and are very meaty while still being juicy. Production is excellent and the tomatoes are simply beautiful, but it is the intense tomato flavor that really makes this one special. These heirloom tomatoes vary between 12 to 14 ozs.



Burpee's Big Boy Indeterminate

Introduced in 1949, its incredible productivity and gorgeous, large (8- to 9-oz/226- to 255-g) scarlet fruit made it an instant hit. Foodies know Big Boy for its sweet, aromatic, melt-in-your-mouth juiciness.



Campbell's Determinate

Produces medium-early, 7 ounce fruits that are oblate, bright red, with green shoulders and good interior color. Sets fruit well under unfavorable conditions, with tolerance to cracking and strong disease resistance.



Carbon Indeterminate

Rich, complex flavors made this variety the winner of heirloom tomato taste tests at Cornell University. Produces large, 8 to 12 ounce, crack resistant fruits - similar to 'Cherokee Purple'. Excellent for salads and sandwiches. Heavy feeders and have a high tolerance for drought and high heat conditions.



Caspian Pink Indeterminate

The Pink Caspian tomato is a globe-shaped, pleated, beefsteak-type tomato that can grow as large as one pound. These big pink-red skinned tomatoes offer up what many describe as a classic tomato flavor with their fine balance of acid and sweetness.



Celebrity Determinate

Long-time classic favorite of Park customers, Celebrity is a superior all-around tomato with such fantastic disease resistance.

These determinate plants are exceptionally strong, bearing masses of smooth, round, bright red tomatoes. Weighing about 8 ounces, they're very uniform (no green shoulders here) and resistant to cracking.



Chef's Choice Bi-Color Indeterminate

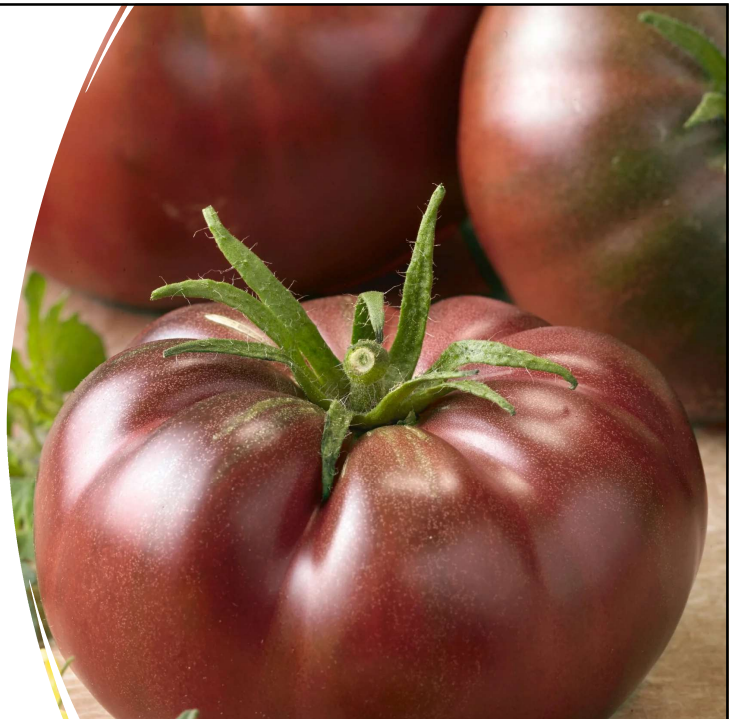

Heirloom-type, pale yellow tomatoes are brushed with deep red splashes on the blossom end and throughout the exquisite lemony yellow flesh. Vigorous plants are heavy yielders. Scab resistant.



Chef's Choice Black Indeterminate

Don't let its unique color deter you, Chef's Choice Black is a meaty, juicy, full flavored tomato with a hint of saltiness that enhances the taste, making it a colorful and delicious salad.

Chef's Choice Black grows strong, healthy 5-foot tall plants producing early to set yields of more than 30, blemish-free fruits throughout the season. Each magnificent tomato is 5 to 6 inches in size, weighing 8 to 10 ounces each.



Chef's Choice Green Indeterminate

A beautiful green colored fruits with subtle yellow stripes and a wonderful citrus-like flavor and perfect tomato texture. You'll enjoy this disease-free plant throughout the season with its dark green leaves and well-behaved form.



Chef's Choice Orange Indeterminate

Orange has a wonderfully bright, almost neon, internal color and superior flesh taste and texture for an early maturing orange tomato. Excellent for soups and sauces because the intense color does not fade or discolor when cooked.



Chef's Choice Pink Indeterminate

A prolific producer of juicy, pink tomatoes. The pink color of this unique variety spreads throughout the entirety of the tomato. The Chef's Choice Pink is not only popular for its unusual coloring, but also for having a wonderful flavor.



Chef's Choice Yellow Indeterminate

Produces luscious, rich yellow colored beefsteak type tomatoes. Everyone will enjoy Chef's Choice Yellow sweet, citrus-like flavor with just the right amount of acid and the perfect tomato texture.



Cherokee Carbon Indeterminate

A gorgeous dusky purple beefsteak with rich, complex flavor, this hybrid is a cross between two heirloom taste-test winners, Cherokee Purple and Carbon. Makes one of the most delicious tomato sandwiches you'll ever taste!



Cherokee Purple Indeterminate

An heirloom originating from the popular old heirloom from Tennessee, Cherokee Purple. 4" beefsteak variety has a great following among celebrity chefs with its rich tomato flavors and wonderful chocolate mahogany color.



Cherry Mix Indeterminate

The plant produces heavy yields of 1 oz cherry tomatoes. They are very sweet, juicy, and flavorful. The gourmet mix of colorful cherry tomatoes comes in various colors: gold, orange, creamy white, yellow, pink, green, purple, and red, and even some bi-colors! Perfect for salads and snacks. An excellent choice for home gardens.



Chocolate Cherry Indeterminate

These indeterminate plants are loaded with clusters of sweet and delicious little gems. The 1-in. cherry-like fruits are rich brick red with deep chocolate shading. These luscious treats are perfect for salads, slicing or canning with an exceptional fresh flavor that is rich and complex.



Cocoa Hybrid Determinante

Get deliciously sweet cherry fruits right from your windowsill or countertop. Plants grow just 6 to 8" tall and wide and produce 1/2 to 1" fruits, stay tidy and benefit from being grown dry. Great grown in containers on patios.



Comstock Sauce and Slice Indeterminate

An Italian variety originally introduced in the early 1980's. Beautiful, meaty, deep-red, roma shaped fruits weigh up to 1 pound and have very few seeds. A dual-purpose variety excellent for canning, pastes, sauces and fresh eating.



Costoluto Genovese Indeterminate

The fluted, old Italian favorite that has been around since the early 19th century. Fruit is rather flattened and quite attractive with its deep ribbing. This variety is a standard in Italy for both fresh eating and preserving, and known for its intensely flavorful, deep red flesh.



Cream Sausage Determinate

Cream Sausage tomatoes are long and cylindrical, typically harvested at around three inches, with ivory-yellow outer skin. Their meaty inner flesh is very juicy, offering a sweet tomato flavor that is slightly acidic and tangy. Known to be an extremely productive cultivar. No staking or caging is needed for this easy-to-grow, bushy little three-foot plant that bears fruit in clusters of about six.



Dancing with Smurfs Indeterminate

Delicious and very unique dark-purple topped, red cherry tomato. This newly available tomato color is referred to as indigo. Disease resistant plants have a purple blush and easily grow to 6'. After we trialed many of the new indigo tomatoes, we decided that Dancing With Smurfs is one of the best tasting.



Delicious Indeterminate

The Delicious Tomato is a World Record giant, bright red beefsteak tomato that can grow to be at least one pound or more. This variety is not only large, but it is also fairly crack resistant. The Delicious tomato gets its name for being very delicious of course!



Dr. Wyche's Indeterminate

Dr. Wyche's variety, producing heavy, reliable yields of the hefty fruit along tall vines with sparse foliage. The plant will produce all season long, and will require staking or caging to support the weight of these gorgeous yellow-orange fruits.



DX-52 Indeterminate

Their high quality sweetness with less acidic flavor provides a bright bite and is great for canning! In fact, this variety was first developed by Dr. Alvin Hamson in the cooler mountainous conditions at Utah State University! Hamson produced disease-resistant tomatoes with a firm texture that can adapt to fluctuating temperatures and higher elevations, as its origin is often mistaken for Colorado.



Early Girl Indeterminate

When gardeners talk about the "first" tomatoes, Early Girl is always there. This may be the most all-round popular hybrid to satisfy that itch for the first fresh tomato of the season. Use them for slicing on a plate, into a salad, or on a sandwich. This a proven all-round early hybrid. Use it to jump start your harvest. Early Girl bears lots of fruit for early harvest, but because the vines are indeterminate, they continue producing through summer.



Fantastic Indeterminate

Plant produces heavy yields of large round red tomatoes all season long. Tomatoes are juicy, meaty, and very flavorful. Tasty, globe-shaped, scarlet red, 3 to 5", medium-sized fruits are almost crack-free.



Garden Peach Indeterminate

This unique heirloom looks very much like a small peach - it even has slightly fuzzy skin! Small, 2 oz., light-yellow fruits have a delicate, distinctive flavor that's light, clean and a little bit fruit-like. A prolific producer of juicy fruits that have excellent keeping quality. Introduced to American gardens in 1862.



German Johnson Indeterminate

German Johnson Tomato is an heirloom, beefsteak variety with higher productivity and more vigor than similar heirloom types. Large slicing tomatoes with the signature acidity of an heirloom tomato.



German Red Strawberry Indeterminate

This German heirloom produces large, red, oxheart-shaped tomatoes that look like a giant strawberry. The 1-lb fruits are loaded with a rich, sweet flavor. With only a small number of seeds and juice, they are great for canning and sandwiches. This superior-tasting tomato is one of the best oxhearts available. Resists cracking.



Giant Belgium Indeterminate

Massive fruits average 2-lbs. but have been reported at nearly 5-lbs. – a serious contender for “world’s largest tomato!” Sweet flavor is so intense that some gardeners actually use it for making wine! Meaty, dark reddish-pink fruits have smooth blossom ends.



Giant Oxheart Indeterminate

This well-named giant produces large, pink, 12 oz. to 2 lb., firm, meaty, heart shaped fruits with thick walls, few seeds and a mild flavor. The vigorous vines produce high yields of fruits that mature late but are well worth the wait!



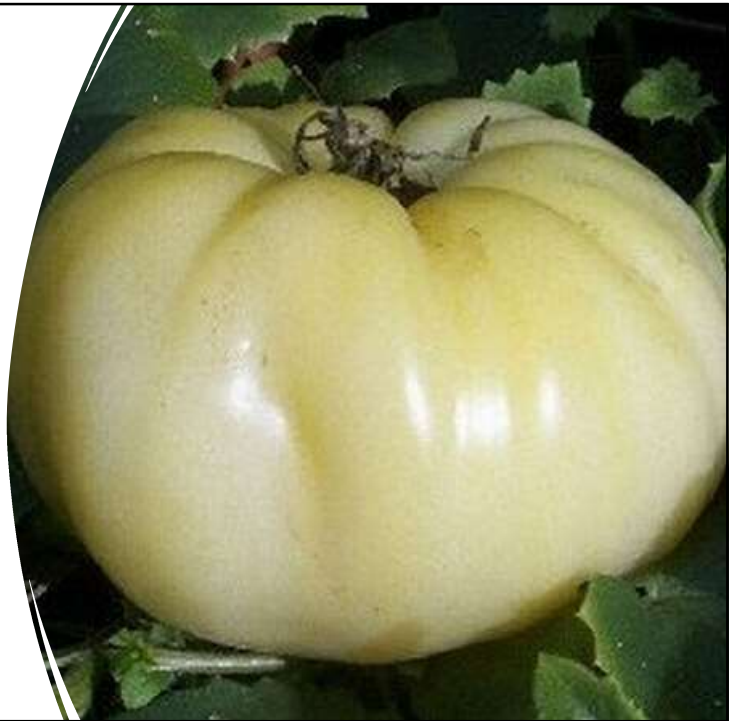
Gold Medal Indeterminate

This gorgeous heirloom tomato lives up to its name both in taste and color! Gold Medal is a beautiful shade of golden yellow, blushing red and pink on both the outside and the inside. It's a deliciously sweet tomato, too, without much acid. That, combined with its firm flesh, makes it perfect for fresh eating!



Great White Indeterminate

The Great White Tomato is an award winning white beefsteak tomato! This unique variety has a creamy inside that grows up to 12 ounces. The Great White is an excellent big multi-purpose slicer with an unique color and a great taste that is low in acid.



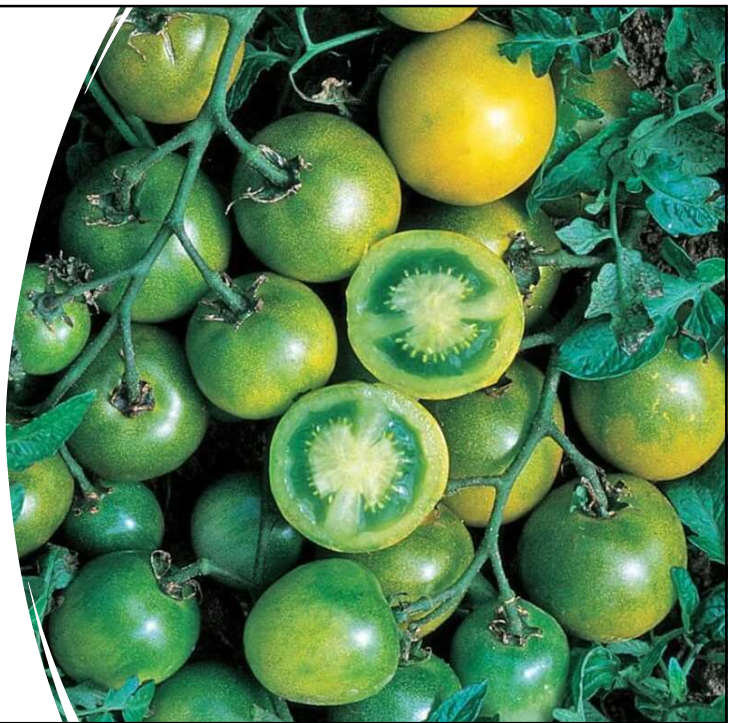
Green Berkeley Tie Dye Indeterminate

If you have not tried a green tomato, you do not know what you are missing. These are a mid-season variety with regular leaves. An indeterminate plant that produces these 8 oz (ca. 302 gram) -16 oz (ca. 605 gram) beefsteak tomato. They have some complex flavors being sweet, acidic and tart which work well together. This tomato would be great for slicing, sandwich and an excellent market seller.



Green Grape Determinate

Our only green cherry is a bright yellow-green when ready to eat, with a very sweet, juicy flavor. Fruits are under 1 inch across, very plentiful on vigorous plants. Ideal for fantastically flavored green soups, sauces – even green ketchup!



Green Zebra Indeterminate

Green Zebra has excellent flavor and unique color—golden green with forest green stripes, developing a slight amber blush when ripe. The 2"–3" tomatoes have very smooth skin essentially free of cracks. Provide support for vines that reach 6' or more. More heat and drought tolerant than other varieties.



Hawaiian Pineapple Indeterminate

Pineapple will remind you of those visits to Grandpa's garden when you were a kid. The beautiful, red-and-yellow streaked tomatoes can weigh up to 1 pound. One taste will transport you back in time with that great old-fashioned, full bodied tomato flavor.



Hillbilly Indeterminate

Absolutely gorgeous bicolor beefsteak tomato, great for slicing. Beautiful yellow 1 pound fruits are streaked with red on the blossom end. Sweet and juicy. Heavy producer.



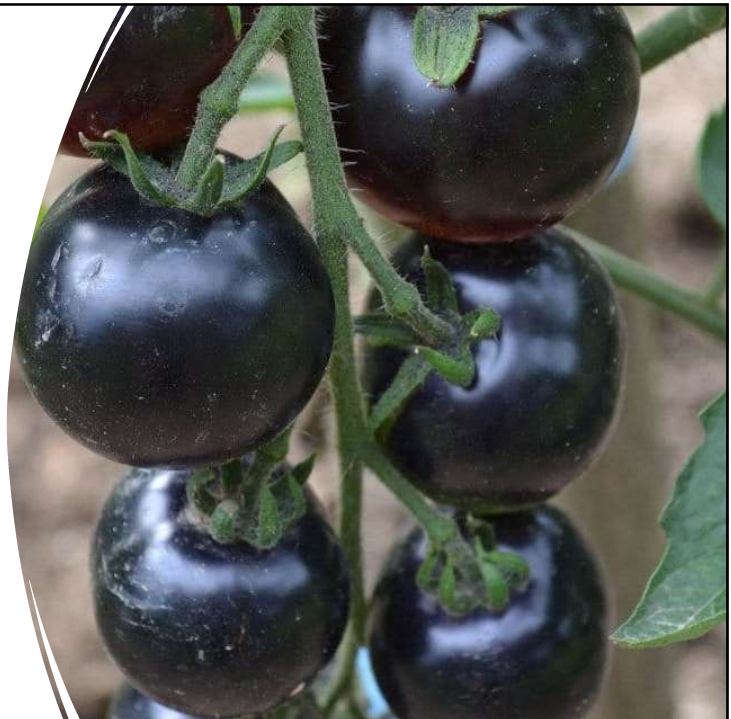
Hungarian Heart Heart Indeterminate

Brilliant reddish-pink oxheart type fruit is large—frequently exceeding one pound! The fruit of this heirloom is firm and meaty like all oxheart types—great for paste, canning or fresh use. The crack-resistant fruit contains very few seeds and shows very little tendency to develop cores—just rich tasting, solid flesh across each hefty slice! Heavy production all season long. Originated outside of Budapest, Hungary, around 1900.



Indigo Rose Indeterminate

Indigo Rose Tomatoes are a medium-sized specialty tomato that is an indeterminate variety. Tasty, dark-colored fruits of about 1-2" are grown in clusters, each ripening at different periods for a long harvesting season.



Isis Candy Indeterminate

The Isis Candy Tomato is a bright red-marbled cherry variety that has a mouth-watering, sweet and fruity flavor that is perfect for fresh eating! This care free tomato plant produces a 1.5" red-marbled variety that has a cats-eye starburst at the blossom end. The Isis Candy adds a fun, bright color to add to a salad or meal!



Janet's Jewel Indeterminate

Large, bright orange striped, beefsteak fruits - many weighing over 1 pound each! Very meaty and sweet tasting with fruity undertones. Late but worth the wait.



Japanese Black Trifele Indeterminate

Good yields of 4–6 oz. fruit with excellent, rich flavor. Harvest when shoulders are still green for best flavor. Potato-leaf plants.



Jaune Flamme Indeterminate

Love an heirloom tomato that's bursting with an intense, fruity flavor? Or a pop of color to incorporate into your favorite dishes? The Jaune Flamme tomato is about to be your new favorite fruit.

Perfect for home gardeners, this small, golden heirloom tomato is disease-resistant and easy to grow.



Jet Star Indeterminate

Heavy yields of firm, meaty, low-acid tomatoes are crack-resistant and especially popular in the northern US since its introduction in 1969. The vines are indeterminate but fairly compact.



Jubilee Indeterminate

Heirloom. First introduced in 1943 as an All-America Selection, Jubilee bears large tomatoes with very meaty, thick-walled interiors and mild flavor. The globe-shaped, golden-orange fruit is similar to Sunray. Has meaty, thick walls and few seeds. High yielding..



Julia Child Indeterminate

Named in honor of the great chef and cookbook author, 'Julia Child' produces deep pink, lightly fluted, 4" beefsteaks. The meaty, juicy tomatoes are irresistible, a lot like their namesake.



Juliet Hybrid Indeterminate

This sweet, juicy tomato looks like an Italian plum tomato but grows in large cherry-type clusters. Packed with flavor, Juliet Grapes are ultra-sweet and meaty and will hold for up to two weeks on the vine. Will produce well into fall and is the most crack-resistant cherry of them all!



Kellogg's Breakfast Indeterminate

Recently named one of the best heirloom tomatoes by the food editors of Sunset Magazine, Kellogg's Breakfast is finally getting the recognition it deserves. Originally bred in Michigan by a gardener named Kellogg, it is absolutely unique, both for its size and for its bold golden skin and juice, exactly the color of fresh-squeezed orange juice.

This giant sets fruit weighing anywhere from 16 to 32 ounces. Slightly flattened, the globes are massive, hanging over the edges of sandwich bread. A good mix of solids and gels makes for a delicious bite, and you'll need many, many bites to finish just one Kellogg's Breakfast.



Kosovo Indeterminate

Kosovo is known for its large, beautiful, intensely flavored, heart-shaped to somewhat flattened fruits. The 10-16 ounce tomatoes are meaty, juicy and sweet, and are frequently held in attractive clusters of 2 or 3. Enjoy Kosovo tomatoes in salads, snacking, and sauces.



Lemon Boy Indeterminate

Lemon Boy Tomato is a hybrid, indeterminate tomato variety that produces bright yellow fruits with the perfect balance of sweet and tangy flavors. This variety is the yellow version of the popular Better Boy tomato variety.



Little Napoli Indeterminate

Finally! A Roma tomato for your patio!

A great performer in containers, this is one of the only patio-type Romas available, and it has disease resistance to Fusarium Race 1 and Verticillium for better garden success. The small plants yield large amounts of tasty paste tomatoes, so gardeners can actually harvest enough at one time to make a batch of salsa or sauce.



Marvel Stripe Indeterminate

The Marvel Stripe tomato is named for the “marvelous” stripes that run down its skin as well as its interior flesh. The largest of bi-colored heirloom tomatoes, these thin-skinned tomatoes can weigh in at one to two pounds and grow to four inches in diameter. Their exterior is deep orange and streaked in thin, blood red strips, and their juicy flesh is colored with the same orange and red of its skin, and is also marbled in white. The Marvel Stripe has a scarce number of seeds, a flat deeply ribbed shape, and a flavor that is smooth, bright, and sweet.



Mexican Indeterminate

42nd Street Greenhouse Original. These babies are HUGE- some coming in at 2 LBS! This open pollinator is constantly getting bigger in size.



Mexico Indeterminate

An old heirloom brought to the America by a Mexican family living in the Midwest. The tomato produces very large, indeterminate, regular-leaf, prolific tomato plants that yield huge sets of 1-2 pound, slightly flattened, irregular-shaped, dark-pink beefsteak tomatoes with terrific bold, tomato flavors. Plenty of sweetness with complementary acid flavors.



Mexico Midget Indeterminate

The taste of a beefsteak tomato disguised into a package the size of a small cherry, the Mexico Midget is an heirloom tomato with an addictive, luscious flavor that will have you growing it year after year.



Mint Julep Indeterminate

Also known as Michael Pollan. Unique plum/pear shaped, 1-1/2 oz. fruits have a pleasant tomato taste with a nice overall sweet flavor that is less tart than other green varieties. Extremely high yields with one plant often producing as much as 5 gallons of fruit!



Moonglow Indeterminate

It produces heavy yields of beautiful, 6-8 oz., 2", blunt-pointed globes. A brilliant, warm-orange slicer with great flavor. A real winner and one of the best, round, gold tomatoes. (Winner of Seed Saver's Exchange 2007 Heirloom Tomato Tasting.) Moon Glow is considered, by many tomato lovers, the tomato with the best texture and flavor of any yellow-gold tomato.



Moonglow Indeterminate

Large, smooth, 1-lb pink fruit has a delicious, rich, sweet taste. This variety has become very popular in recent years and was developed by M.C. Byles of Logan, West Virginia. After crossing varieties for 6 years and selecting the best, he introduced this beauty that he named Mortgage Lifter in the 1940s, after he sold plants for \$1 each and paid off the \$6000 mortgage on his house.



Moscow Determinante

The VR Moscow Tomato was created by Utah State University to thrive in vast intermountain regions, and named after Moscow, Idaho. Vigorous vines produce very respectable 1-2 lb. fruits that are a vivid red. This very robust beefsteak slicer with thick walls and juicy flesh offers voluptuous, rich, old-fashioned tomato flavor.



Mountain Fresh Determinate

The fruit of the Mountain Fresh tomato plant is large, ranging from eight to sixteen ounces, and bright red in color. Thanks to its resistance to cracking, the tomato's skin is smooth and firm. The plant itself is leafy, shading the fruit and protecting them from scalding.



Mountain Spring Determinate

As a medium-early tomato, mountain spring plants thrive in almost any garden as long they receive plenty of sunlight and frost-free days. Ripening in just 65 to 75 days from the date of planting, the deep red, mild, crack-resistant fruits taste great fresh, canned or cooked.



Mr. Stripey Indeterminate

These huge, beefsteak-type red-and yellow fruits with a high sugar content are delicious and pretty to slice because of the bi-coloring. Although the variety is called Mr. Stripey, don't expect perfect stripes. This is an heirloom and no two tomatoes are ever the same. The background color of the tomato is yellow to light orange, and the red often appears in little spots that align themselves in stripes radiating from the stem end of the fruit.



Old German Indeterminate

Indulge in one of these treasured heirlooms and experience the true meaning of pleasure! Routinely weighing in at over a pound and a half, Old German was one of the largest fruit in our trials. It is both delicious and beautiful with succulent, meaty fruit and golden streaked, reddish skin.



Omar Lebanese Indeterminate

Paul Robeson Indeterminate

The Paul Robeson Tomato is an old fashioned Russian heirloom that has a very tasty flesh that is juicy with a great acid and sweet balance. This deep maroon colored variety is slightly flattened and round and grows up to 4." The Paul Robeson Tomato is an excellent choice for cooler growing regions.



Pineapple Indeterminate

Very large, up to 2 lbs each. The yellow fruit has red marbling through the flesh and is one of the most beautiful tomatoes we sell. The flavor is very sweet and fruity; good yields!



Pineapple Pig Indeterminate

Pineapple Pig tomatoes are large and plump, weighing up to 1 or 2 pounds, with a somewhat rounded, bumpy shape. The fruits ripen to a creamy yellow color with light green stripes or specks and a pale pink blush.



Pink Berkley Tie Dye Indeterminate

Compact plants produce beautiful 8-12 ounce fruit with a very sweet, rich, dark tomato flavor. 10 out of 10 people liked the port wine colored beefsteak with metallic green stripes better than Cherokee Purple in a farmers market taste off.



Pink Brandywine Indeterminate

Pink Brandywine tomatoes have a rich, slightly sweet yet spicy old-fashioned tomato flavor that has been prized for decades. They are delicious eaten raw, but they can also be sautéed, grilled, stewed, and used in numerous dishes. Tomatoes pair particularly well with savory herbs and soft cheeses.



Plum Regale Determinate

San Marzano Indeterminate

The San Marzano Tomato is an Italian heirloom plum-type tomato cultivar prized for its refined, balanced flavor. This thin, pointed variety is most often used in cooked applications such as on pizzas or in pasta sauce.



Silvery Fir Tree Determinante

Silvery Fir Tree' plants are compact (eighteen to twenty-four inches high) with interesting, unusual, delicate, lacy leaves. Some gardeners report that it does not require staking. However with the weight of the fruit, we found that it greatly does benefit from support. The fruit are red in color, oblate in shape, weigh between four to ten ounces each, have a meaty texture, and in our fields deliver an excellent, balanced flavor.



Striped German Indeterminate

These bicolored beauties are wonderfully sweet and fruity. Fruits weighing 12-16 ounces have gorgeous red and yellow skin and marbled flesh. A mouthwatering slicer with firm but smooth texture, Striped German is also great for canning. Expect heavy yields.



Sungold Indeterminate

Small fruits averaging 8.2g, borne in prolific clusters, ripen very early to a rich apricot color and keep producing till frost. A perfect combination of deep sweetness with a hint of acidic citrusy tartness,



Sunsugar Indeterminate

An early maturing cherry tomato with a high sugar content that is a customer favorite for a reason! These beautiful cherry sized orange tomatoes will be the first tomato to harvest in early summer.



Super Sioux Indeterminate

This new tomato developed by the same breeder of Early Girl and Better Boy Hybrids, produces blemish-free fruits about 33% larger than Early Girl with marvelous flavor that's sweet and juicy. Strong, vigorous plants are capable of tremendous yields. Strong disease resistance.



Umberto Indeterminate

A very old heirloom variety brought back from near extinction. Just one plant can produce up to 250 pink, meaty, 2 ounce fruits. Robust flavor is excellent for both fresh eating and sauces.



Vintage Wine Determinante

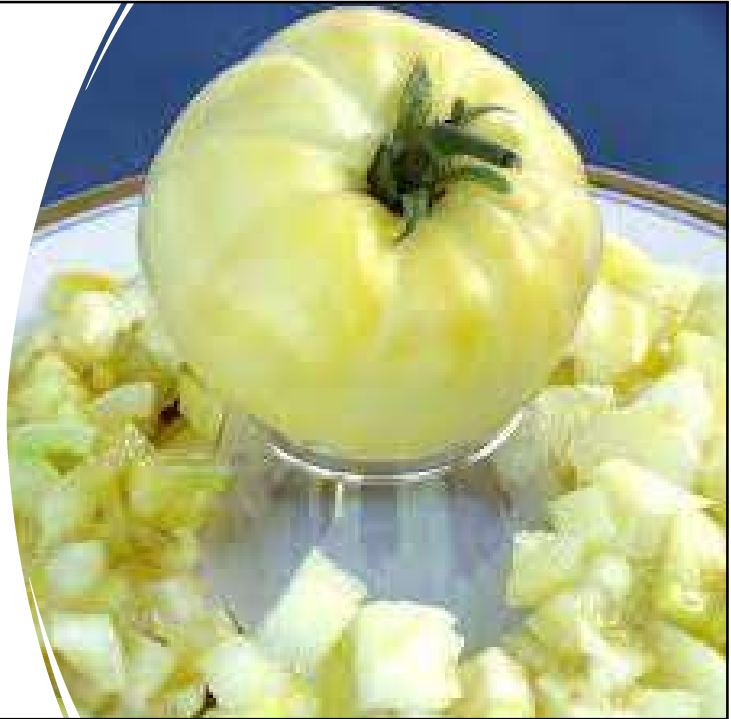
Virginia Sweet Indeterminate
